#### Arbor Day

National Arbor Day is April 29, 2022. This year marks the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the tree planter's holiday.

On January 4, 1872, J. Sterling Morton, a strong advocate of trees, first proposed a tree planting holiday to be called "Arbor Day" at a meeting of the Nebraska State Board of Agriculture.

Today, Arbor Day is celebrated in all 50 states and typically falls on the last Friday of April. This holiday celebrates the importance of trees and makes a promise to the future with the belief that each tree will grow to provide clean air and water, cooling shade, wildlife habitat, a healthier community and natural beauty.

The planting of a tree is a promise to the future, which is why we love to have our local schools join us in the Arbor Day celebration. We plant a tree as a promise to their future, while they begin their journey learning to be good stewards of our urban forest
